







The Write Prompt Rubric

-  Teachers have four score options to choose from when grading Write responses: 1, 2, 3 and 4.
-  Each score corresponds to a level of writing. These descriptions can also be found when hovering over the number score when grading a write prompt response.
-  Teachers can also provide feedback in the comments portion of the grading box and return the response back for revision before scoring.

1	Emerging: Doesn't make a claim, or doesn't clearly explain or examine a topic/idea.
2	Developing: Partially supports a claim with some reasons, or partially explains or examines a topic/idea with some clarity.
3	Proficient: Supports a claim with clear reasons and relevant evidence, or clearly and fully explains or examines a topic/idea.
4	Exemplary: Expertly supports a claim with reasons and evidence, or explains or examines a topic/idea with exceptional clarity.
