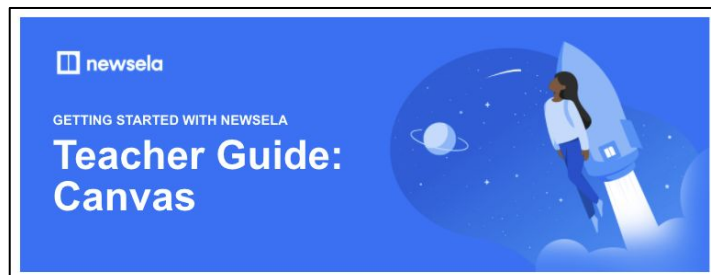

Assignment Basics

Teachers can assign individual articles or groups of articles (Text Sets). When teachers assign articles, students see the assignments on their Newsela homepage. Even if the teacher does not customize the assignment, when students go to an assigned article at [newsela.com](#) or on the [Newsela mobile app](#) they can complete the following actions:

- Read the article at all reading levels
- Take the quiz at all reading levels
- Highlight and annotate at all reading levels
- Submit a writing response to the Newsela writing prompt
- Complete Power Words activities (when the school has Newsela ELA and the article has Power Words)

Teachers can customize Newsela assignments with Class Instructions, Annotations, and Writing Prompts. In the rest of this section, you can find Instructions for using these features.
