



Introductory Task – Robots in Reality



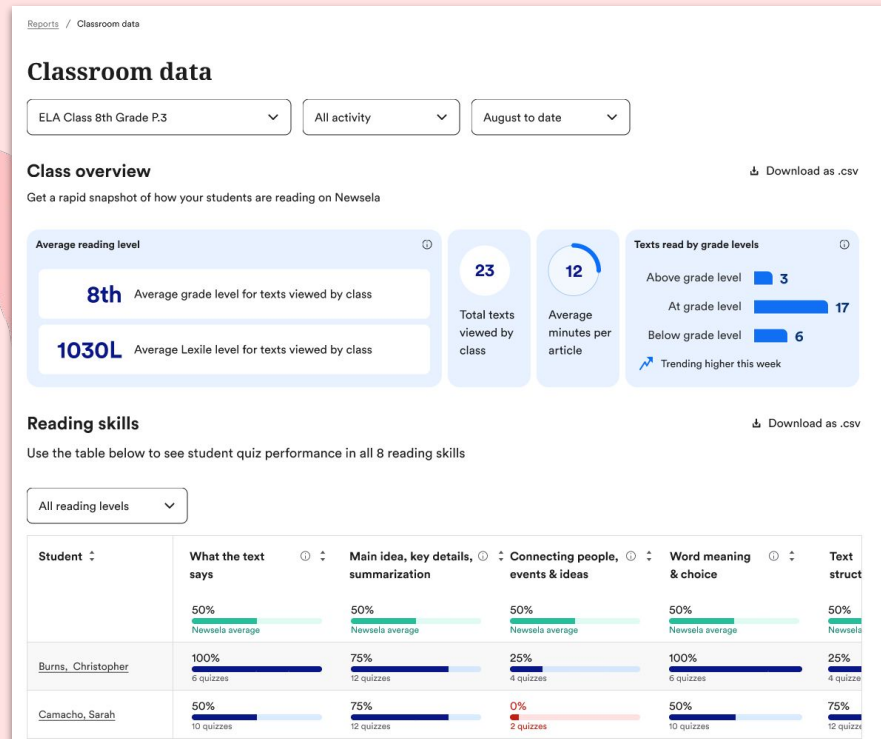
