



# Build a weekly skills routine with Newsela

Set specific routines with Newsela so it becomes second nature for students



## **Newsela Day**

Pick a day of the week for Newsela reading.

## **Weekly Skill Focus**




## Use the reading skills filter


# Assign standards-aligned quizzes regularly

#### Quizzes:

- Provide students with immediate feedback
- Help teachers track how students are performing with key skills

#### Quizzes also help inform reading level

After reading five articles and completing quizzes, students will begin to receive articles at their reading level rather than at the grade level of their classroom.






## Leverage leveled texts

Texts in Newsela are available at 5 different reading levels.

You can set the reading level or let Newsela set it automatically at each student's reading level.

Setting the reading level ensures your students get practice reading and developing skills at grade level. Use the Newsela recommended level as a way to help students work up to grade-level tasks.





## **Annotations**


Helps students engage in active learning by highlighting and taking notes within a text.

#### **Suggested routine:**

- I do (direct instruction) Use the annotation tool to model skill application during whole-class read or small group instruction.
- We do (guided practice) Invite students to annotate alongside you.
- You do (independent practice) In the assignment instructions, prompt students to use the annotation tool to highlight or comment.

### Ideas to use the four highlight colors:


Questions = yellow Main idea = green Key details = blue Connections = pink



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


